View from the Board

For those of you who wonder, no we are not installing a beach in anticipation of the Center becoming waterfront property! Actually, as I reported in a recent email, we have entered into a short-term agreement with Dowdy Plumbing which will result in a major improvement to our parking lot.

Dowdy and company will use the back corner of our property (the area where the Gadsden Street fence is) to stage a large load of dirt which they will move to a building site they are constructing. In addition to making monthly payments over the next six months, they will make significant improvements in the parking lot including re-sodding, bringing in gravel to redefine the driveway, and improving the entrance/exits onto Gadsden and Carolina Streets. We look forward to these improvements.

During this time, we encourage you to park along the Carolina Street side and in the middle sections of the parking lot.

With respect to renters and Garden Club events, we are working with Beth McGrotha, Venue Director, and the Committee Chairs who have events coming up, to make this as seamless as possible.

January's winter nights have taken a toll not only on our outdoor plants, but on the HVAC system that serves the apartment. The Board is getting estimates to replace the ductwork and unit that heats and cools that portion of the Center. It is long overdue and has been held together with "band aids" for several years.

As reported last month, there now exists an Upholstery Fund to spruce up the furnishings in the Trophy room. Very rough estimates of what each upholstery project will cost are:

Garden Therapy

Five members of the Nasturtium Garden Circle did our circle's TGC garden therapy project at the new center of the PACE Center for Girls at 311 East Jennings, just off South Monroe St.

PACE is a public middle and high school for girls in Tallahassee. Last summer the school had moved to its new location and the PACE leadership team asked both the TGC and the Zonta Club of Tallahassee for help replanting two large planting containers at its two entrances, one for the students and staff and the other for the public. One Nasturtium member is also a member of the Zonta Club.

We undertook the project and bought a few plants and contributed others from our own gardens. Most plants survived the winter, especially the Billbergia manarae and the petunias. The PACE staff waters the plants. We go back once a month to spruce up and fertilize the plants. Doing this project gave our circle members a chance to learn more about PACE and to work together doing our garden therapy project for the TGC.
