Around the House with the Board of Trustees

March will be under a new roof at the Garden Center, ending our concerns about leaking in various places and allowing us to do some repainting of small areas of the ceiling! Flowers are showing and buds are bursting. Spring cannot be too far away!

The Board of Trustees added the word Holidays to our weekend rental rates as reported earlier this year. Holiday dates now rent at the same rate as weekend days. Last month the BOT adopted a definition of "holiday." For purposes of determining fees for renting the Garden Center for an event, holiday means:

- New Year's Day on Jan 1
- Birthday of MLK Jr. -- Jan 15-21 third Monday in January*
- Washington's birthday (President's Day) -- Feb 15-21 third Monday in February*
- Memorial Day -- May 25-31 Last Monday in May*
- Independence Day on July 4
- Labor Day -- Sept 1-7 First Monday in September*
- Columbus Day -- October 8-14 Second Monday in October*
- Veterans Day on November 11
- Thanksgiving Day -- November 22-28 Fourth Thursday in November*
- The Friday after Thanksgiving Day
- Christmas Eve
- Christmas Day on December 25 (House is closed)
- December 26 through and including December 31 (New Year's Eve)

*These are floating holidays. The dates vary in any given year but occur within the date ranges listed.

We continue to encourage rentals of our beautiful home. We have three outdoor weddings and two other rentals that could be either outdoor or indoor depending on the weather—a busy March! Members can get discounts—check out the yearbook pages 92—95 for more information. And members, if you are seeking a discount, and let us know the year you joined or years you held club-wide positions, we can verify that more quickly and sign off on the <u>substantial</u> discounts that are available!

You may not know this, but our wonderful Venue Director is an independent contractor and our venue is not her only responsibility. You know she will try to help you in any way that she can, but she does have other outside obligations.
