The Garden Center has her new spring “hat” on—oh, wait, that’s the completed new roof! Yet, if spring has sprung in all its finery, why do we still have the heat on?! We will probably be yearning for this weather in July and August...

Marilyn Larson, BOT Treasurer, will soon be placing orders for memorial plaques honoring deceased members of TGC. The qualifying amount for inscribing the member’s name on a plaque is \$100.00. By the way, that new roof is completely paid for thanks to previous Boards that have been reserving and building up funds for several years in order to afford this necessary expenditure. You know we don’t buy it unless the money is already in the bank. Some of those big numbers in the monthly budget reports that look like spendable funds are really reserved funds (much like escrow accounts in real estate) for items such as improved technology, a new HVAC system that will be needed in a few years, eventual appliance replacements in the kitchen or apartment, and, of course, security deposits already paid that may need to be returned in whole or in part to our rental clients.

Dr. Bernice Proctor Venable, a member of the Board of Overseers for Rutgers University in New Jersey, sent a donation in gratitude for cosponsoring the Hidden History project in November. What a happy surprise! I had the pleasure of briefly meeting her when she visited earlier—a delightful and dedicated woman. Her personal story is a real testament to the human spirit.

Additionally, the Board has received a generous donation from Shannon Forest Circle to support one or more of the short-term goals for the house. The garbage gazebo is going to get spiffy real soon—thanks! If your circle is interested, the short-term goals in the front of the yearbook on page xix are items the BOT wants to accomplish to enhance the building’s usability and “rent-ability”. We all benefit from the many generous members who give their time, talents, and tangible goods—thank you!

Hope Community Volunteer Group Seeking a New Home

A BAG for HOPE, a local group of volunteers who support the needs of the children at the Big Bend Homeless Coalitions' Hope Community, is seeking a new location. After headquartering their operations in a North Monroe Street space graciously donated rent-free by Sunbelt Asset Management for the last eight years, they have been asked to find a new home prior to April 30 to accommodate the needs of another tenant.



A Bag for Hope (ABFH) volunteers support these homeless children by creating and sewing a variety of household and personal products made from donated fabric and supplies. These goods are sold at local events throughout the year. All proceeds are dedicated to the Hope Community.

Since its inception nine years ago by co-founders Lynne Corbett and Libby Penrod, the ABFH group has donated nearly \$90,000 from the sale of their creations to the Hope Community. Over the years this money has been used to provide the children with school uniforms and supplies, birth certificates needed to attend school, and the development of a library equipped with laptops for homework and study. ABFH has coordinated the development and maintenance of the recreational areas available to the children of HOPE Community and contributed significant funding to those projects. Most recently a new basketball court was installed.

The donation of a new space is desperately needed for ABFH to continue its operation. In addition to holding weekly event planning meetings at the current 350 square foot cooled and heated space, all fabric and products are stored at this location.




